

Oxford Bank Employees Focus On Their Community

2004 was an active year for Oxford Bank employees as they continued the Bank's long tradition of making a difference in the communities and lives of the people it serves. Some of the highlights include:

In February, Bank employees distributed two checks in the amount of \$800.00 each to two local charities as part of the Oxford Bank's "Dress Down For Charity" program. The program allows each employee the opportunity to donate, at least, \$1.00 to charity in exchange for dressing in casual attire one day each month. The \$1,600.00 distributed this year was raised throughout 2003. Employees selected the Problem Pregnancy Center of Oxford and Oxford-Orion FISH as this year's recipients.

In June, Bank employees presented a \$2,075.00 check to HAVEN of Oakland County. The money was raised through the promotion and sales of Coins of America's Michigan State Quarter Collectors Sets. A total of 1,660 coin sets were sold at Oxford Bank's six retail-banking locations between February and April.

On October 8, 116 Bank employees helped raise a total of \$584.00 for the Susan B. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation as part of Lee National Denim Day.

A total of \$4,000.00 was raised by Oxford Bank and its employees for the United Way and many of its' partnering organizations and community programs. The money was collected via payroll deductions of participating individuals.

A total of 21 employees at three different Bank locations delivered "Meals-On-Wheels" every Thursday of each month to homebound seniors throughout the Oxford area.

Each Tuesday morning, employees continued to offer an on-site banking facility to the residents of the Independence Village retirement community in Oxford Township.
